The major portion of the campaign, \$25,000,000.00, will be used to establish an endowment fund to help with the religious formation of our children. The other things that the campaign will fund is seminary education, Priest health care and retirement and various other programs in the diocese. I will be needing people to serve on the campaign in our parish. I will be sending out letters and asking for your help to meet our parish goal. St. Peters parish goal is, \$740,000.00. If we met our goal 17% will be returned to Saint Peters. If we exceed our goal Saint Peters will receive 75% of the funds that exceed our goal. This campaign will be a blessing to our religious education programs and to our school. I think that I have a plan that will make it very easy for us to reach our goal of \$740,000.00. The pledge period for the campaign is three years. Please watch for continued updates for the campaign. I hope that many of you will help in making the campaign a success. We have been successful in all of the campaigns in our diocese.

#### End of the fiscal year.

The fiscal year ends for Saint Peters on June 30th. We have had another good year although I do not know what the year end total will be until the first part of July. You are an amazing parish family and your generosity to Saint Peters is one of the greatest sign of Jesus' presence in your life.
