Ignite

The Ignite campaign will begin for us in August with meetings. I have written before that our goal is \$740,000.00. I have written the committee and asked that our goal be reduced because of the support of Saint Albert that our parishes gives each year. I doubt that the goal will be reduced but I hope that there will be some reduction.

The Ignite Campaign is a three year pledge. The purpose of the Campaign is to develop endowment funds to help with religious education programs, Catholic School, seminarians and priest retirement. Our goal may seem impossible but I have developed a plan that with everyone's help we can exceed our goal and receive a large refund from the campaign. This is my formula.

50 families give \$2,000.00 a year for 3 years
\$300,000.00.

100 Parishioners give \$1,000.00 a year for 3 years
\$300,000.00.

100 parishioners give \$500.00 for 3 years
\$150,000.00.

100 parishioners give \$250.00 for 3 year
\$75,000.00

100 parishioners give \$125.00 for 3 years \$37,500.

The remainder of the parish make a pledge.

The grand total is \$862,500.00. The past campaign, "Sharing God's Gifts" that we did give over \$800,000.00 to the campaign. This is a very ambitious goal but if we get maximum participation we can exceed our goal.

If we reach the goal of \$862,500.00 Saint Peters would receive \$215,000.00 as a refund from the Ignite campaign. This is very important to remember that we can receive over \$200,000.00 to the parish.

Oktoberfest

We are very excited that Michelle and Terry Oswald have joined our Oktoberfest team. We will be starting our Oktoberfest meetings this month. This will be my 26th Oktoberfest and working with the couples for Oktoberfest is an absolute joy. There may be some major changes to how we do Oktoberfest this year because of the cost of food and other supplies. We are investigating the costs and we are particularly concerned with the cost of meat. We will keep you informed of the changes taking place. We have been so successful with Oktoberfest and this year will be the same. This will be our 52nd Oktoberfest.

Children's Liturgy.

One of the great ministries in our church is the Children's Liturgy of the word. This program is during the 10:00 a.m. mass and it gives parents an opportunity to have their children learn a lesson about this weeks gospel and it enables the parents to be more focused on the mass.

Ministers Needed.

We are in need of ministers at all the masses, Lectors, ushers, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers. The 4:00 p.m. mass is especially in need of Altar Servers. One of the things I encourage the adults to considering is being an Altar Server. I have heard so many people say that they never were able to serve and being an adult server is a great opportunity to fill the void in their life. When you are a minister in the church you are always given special graces that will make your life filled with joy.
