Pray For An End to Pandemic

There have been many ways that have been suggested to combat the pandemic and the one way that we have not emphasized enough is for us to pray to Jesus to help us end this terrible time for so many people. The rosary is a great pray that can be offered for an end to the pandemic.

IGNITE.

We will be starting the planning for the Diocesan drive which is called, "Ignite". The goal for the drive is \$45,000,000.00. The reason for the drive is that there are monies needed for Seminarian education which cost almost \$40,000.00 a year to educate a seminarian. There is also money for the priest retirement fund. The major portion of the drive is for education of our children. The education goal has two parts: First, there will be money in a fund for the funding of our Catholic Schools throughout the diocese. Second, there will be a fund established to help fund the religious education programs in all of the parish in the diocese. The needs of our diocese are great and I know that we finished the, Sharing God's Gifts, drive a few years ago.

The greatest challenge for our parish is to reach our goal. The goal for Saint Peters is \$740,000.00. If we reach or goal 17% of the money will be returned to the parish. If we exceed our goal 75% of the money raised will be returned to the parish. In the last drive we pledged over \$1,000,000.00. When I think about this goal I can be very concerned but when I break this down I believe we can reach our goal. The pledges are for three years. If we have 250 families that can pledge a \$1,000.00 a year for three years we will reach our goal. If we had 125 families that would pledge \$2,000.00 a year for three years we would reach our goal. I may be optimistic but if everyone does their part them we will reach our goal. The best aspect of this drive is that we will receive money from the endowments for our religious education programs and for Saint Albert.

The new year has begun and it is time for us to contemplate our spiritual plan for the coming year. My thought for this week is for all of us to spend a half an hour planning our spiritual goals for the coming year.

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. This brings to an end the season of Christmas. The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation or epiphany which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in the Jordan. Jesus descended into the River to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget sons of God. The event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervenes.

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin. - Right Rev. Msgr. Rudolph G. 
