Educational Saving Account.

The Educational Saving Accounts that the Iowa house, senate and Governor Reynolds signed into law has opened the opportunity for any child who wishes to attend Saint Albert to have that opportunity. This program will be phased in for the school in a three year process. If you have children that attends a public school and you would like to send them to Saint Albert you will qualify to receive the \$7600.00 Educational Savings Account. Tithing Challenge

Fourth, you can put your check in the collection basket and we will process the check when we count the collection. Fifth, if you tithe in cash put the cash in the envelope with your name on the outside of the envelope. Thank you for helping us keep current with our tithing for the year.


