TWENTY-EIGHT SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Father Jacob	
"How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!"	We have two very beautiful days of prayer and praise coming up in a few weeks:
to enter the kingdom of God!" I used to think we needed to work to understand what Jesus meant when He said things like this. How could we explain it? Like the apostles, I was "amazed at His words". Then I spent a summer as a seminarian working at a large hospital up in Minnesota, which is both the "safety net" hospital for Minneapolis and the main trauma center for the state and for much of North and South Dakota. It was a great place for me to intern because I got to meet <i>everybody</i> there, and, among many things I learned, I noticed one thing over and over: Whenever I visited somebody with means, they would talk to me extensively about what they were going to do to deal with their problems, and how they wanted God to give them back the comfort or success they had had before. They'd be blessed when they could get back to their house, or motorcycle, or job. When I visited somebody who was poor, they would talk about what they needed and wanted God to do to help them. They would easily and naturally turn to prayer and pour out to God their troubles, and ask God to be with them. They'd be blessed when they knew God was with them there, in the middle of their troubles. In short, when I went to visit rich people, I met an awful lot of pagans—people who wanted to appease the gods so they would leave them alone to go on with their own lives in comfort. It was mostly only when I met with poor people that I met Christians—people who wanted God to be <i>im</i> their lives in good times and in bad. You might see a Tabernacle veil at many (but certainly not all) Catholic Churches, often in front of the door, or else all the way around the Tabernacle if it is free standing like ours. Why would we use a veil like that? Well we use paint, boxes, glass and locks, or clothing to protect and honor all of the most precious things in life, including our own bodies, the altar at Mass, your jewelry, etc etc. The veil on the Tabernacle also brings to mind the veil on the Holy of Holies in the Temple in Jerusalem, which was about 30 feet tall and veiled the presence of God with His people. That
to enter the kingdom of God!"	veil was "torn in two" on the day Jesus died, just like ours on our Tabernacle.
