TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Father Jacob

"Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."

This is a hard saying. Who can accept it?

Jesus never shied away from teaching us hard truths, and his teaching on the permanence and indissolubility of marriage is a prime example of that. This direct and clear teaching of Jesus is for many a very hard thing to accept.

I won't waste column space here defending the Lord's teaching: He is perfectly clear about it in today's Gospel, as well as in Matthew and Luke. Instead I want to note two things:

1. Divorce and remarriage

I can't tell you how many people I have met who have the mistaken impression that having a marriage that ended in divorce itself disqualifies them from living as a Catholic. This is not true! And I am hereby making all of you my messengers to the whole town that it's not true.

Divorce is always a tragedy, it is sometimes the best way forward for a particular family in their specific circumstances. Whether for good reason or not, it does not cut us off from the Church. What is not possible, since a marriage is a permanent joining, is to be married again. Even here though, we come to point two:

2. There is always a way forward

The Lord never leaves us stranded, and neither does His Church. There is always a way forward, because it is impossible that we could ever be permanently shut off from the Father in this life. There is a way forward. Let's chart it together.
