

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Father Jacob

Come now, you rich,

weep and wail over your impending miseries.

In our last reading from the Letter of St James, we have a scathing indictment of worldly riches. If we are accustomed to thinking of riches as only applying to "those other people way richer than me", then we would do well to remember that we live in the richest society that the world has ever seen, and that even the poorest among us enjoy luxuries Roman emperors could barely have imagined. Could it be that this passage is about me?

The Bible, both Old Testament and New, is full to bursting with denunciations of the rich. Having an abundance of the goods of this world is not itself evil (in fact, it is often an occasion to give thanks to God), but it very often does come with evil. Consider:

The goods of this world belong ultimately to God, their maker. I have them as though on loan: would I get my "deposit" back?

If we have more, we will have to give an account for it. Do I recognize that my abundance places an obligation on me to be generous?

Having money allows us to separate ourselves from many inconveniences. Do I treat poor people or people with problems as inconveniences and separate myself from them?

Wealth often gives us the opportunity to take advantage of others. Today these people are often out of sight (and not on accident). Am I attentive to those who harvest my fields? Spin my cloth? Assemble my toys? This is difficult to keep track of but we have an obligation to do our reasonable best: the plight of these poor people cries out to God against those who take advantage of them. Including, potentially, me.
