THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Father Jacob

The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your soul, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

In a million different times and places, people have been anxious because they have wondered "do I have what it takes?" I have several friends who are house-hunting right now, and they are nervous at times as they wonder if they'll be able to afford this or that "house of their dreams". What if they don't have the money for the down payment?

I remember how nervous I was to try out for the school play in high school. I wondered if I'd be good enough to get the part, if I had what was needed. It was an Agatha Christi murder mystery and I really wanted the part of a psychologist. I didn't get the part (I think I've gotten over it by now). Sometimes in life we don't have what is required.

With God, we never have to worry or be anxious. God doesn't want anything more than you have to give. It is impossible that God would ever demand of you more than He gave you in the first place. He does not demand the impossible.

All God wants from you is what He gave you in the first place...everything. Everything that you have, and everything that you are.

All your heart, All your soul

All your mind, All your strength

But remember, that's not anything more than you have to give!

It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins. (2 Maccabees 12:46)

To pray for the living and the dead is one of the works of mercy, and is an important expression of our love and communion: how can you show your love for those who have died? You can pray for them!

The Church invites us to pray for the dead especially during this month of November, and even more especially this week after All Souls' Day. <u>Please join me in visiting a</u> <u>cemetery this week and praying for the dead.</u>

Why does the Church so encourage this practice? Because the dead need our prayers, and it is good and loving to offer them for them, but also because it is good *for me* to remember that I will die someday soon, and to start to live accordingly.

You'll find me this week taking a walk around St Joseph's Cemetery praying the rosary. You could visit the graves of loved ones, or pray for all those buried there. You could pray a decade of the rosary, read the readings for next Sunday, or just spend some time in quiet with the Lord.

However you do it, please pray for the dead this week and every week. We are not separated from them, and many of them need our prayers.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

And let perpetual light shine upon them.

May they rest in peace, amen.

May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.
