The Baptism of the Lord

Why did Jesus go to be baptized by John in the Jordan? Why did all these things happen?

Did Jesus need forgiveness of his sins? He is the perfect Holy One of God.

Did Jesus need Heaven opened? He is the one who came down from Heaven.

Did Jesus need to receive the Holy Spirit? He is the source of the Spirit, always filled with the Spirit.

Did Jesus need to hear the Father say "You are beloved Son"? He is the Son begotten before all ages, always dwelling with the Father.

No. Jesus didn't need any of these things. All these things happened when Jesus was baptized so that, when *you* were baptized, maybe as a young child, maybe at the Easter vigil Mass a few years ago, these things would be accomplished in *you*.

You needed your sins washed away (and might need them wiped away again). You needed Heaven opened. You needed to receive the Holy Spirit. You needed to be called by God his beloved son or daughter.

Jesus did all these things to "hallow the waters" so that, when you were joined to Him in your baptism however many years ago, all these things would be true of you. You were cleansed (and can be cleansed again if need be). You were made a citizen of heaven. You were filled with the Holy Spirit (and later strengthened by the same Spirit in Confirmation). You became a beloved son or daughter of the Father.

Give thanks to God for your baptism today, the day when He shared His life with you and brought you int His family, making you a beloved son or daughter who can call Him Father.


