

From Father Jacob

Miracles

To a lot of people the miracles of Jesus seem very strange, but when we remember who Jesus is, they don't need to.

The same God who turned water into wine in the six jars at Cana, is the same God who turns water into juice in every grapevine in the world and then into wine by every yeast cell. Do we think he is in charge of one and not the other? Jesus is the Word of God that made the whole world ("let there be light!"), and continues to govern the whole world (see for example Ps 104). When Jesus heals the sick he isn't doing anything that he's not normally in charge of in every body on Earth anyway. When he restores Lazarus to life he is doing a smaller thing than when he gives life to thousands of babies in the womb every day. The difference is just that one is done through a man, Jesus Christ, and one is done invisibly, and so commonly that we forget to praise the one who does it.

If we find Jesus's miracles to be strange then there are two possible reasons. First, perhaps we need to remember who Jesus is—it would be strange indeed if *Fr Jake* made water turn into wine, as that is not something I am accustomed to do, but it is not strange for the Word of God to do it, since He does it all the time. He is doing it right now at your nearest vineyard. As the song says truly: "He's got the whole world in His hand".

Second, perhaps we need to look again at the wild and wonderful world that God has made, full of life and beauty and goodness. If we marvel too much at the miracles of Jesus-man, perhaps it's because we marvel too little at the daily working of Jesus-God, the wisdom of God and the power of God, who makes the sun rise every day and the rain fall and every seed sprout and grow according to its kind. May we never lose sight of God's mighty care for us.


