THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Father Jacob

Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it.

This is an enormously important passage of the Scriptures, and it bears a little bit of detailed examination. If you read this passage carefully you will note that the metaphor is *not* between the body and the Church (ie: the Church is *like* body), but rather between the body and Christ (ie: the body of Christ works like a natural body). St Paul doesn't think that the Church is somehow *like* the body of Christ. St Paul thinks that the Church *is* the body of Christ.

The Scriptures everywhere teach that there is a radical unity and importance to the Church that Jesus has established. Jesus talks about being the vine. He prays that we might be one *as he and the Father are one*. St Paul elsewhere calls the Church a "temple built of living stones" and everyone takes for granted that Christians are "brothers and sisters", which is to say, family.

Why is this so important? A lot of reasons! I'll mention two today:

The Church is not a club. I have joined and quit a lot of clubs over my 36 years of life, and for a lot of reasons. The Church is a fundamentally different thing. What if a foot *did* say, "because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body", and separated itself? The easy answer is that it would die. It would not have the life of the body in it.

There's no room for jealousy or selfishness in a healthy body. The eye has a role to play, as does the foot, and whether the foot does that job or not *matters to the whole body*, because it keeps the body healthy and able to move. Jesus has a job for you as well, and whether you will take up that job isn't just a concern for you and Jesus. We need you!

A Year acceptable to the Lord

When Jesus comes proclaiming glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, and letting the oppressed go free, he is proclaiming a Jubilee year. The Jubilee was a very important concept in God's vision for Israel. It was the part of the Law, and the Prophets are always bringing it up in their accusations and also in their oracles of Israel's future. In the jubilee year all debts are supposed to be forgiven, all captives are freed, all land returns to its owners, and everyone goes home to their ancestral land. It's easy to dismiss this vision as utopian (and indeed it is not clear that ancient Israel much observed the Jubilee in practice), but it is a beautiful vision: God's people need to be restored to **freedom**, to family, to the fullness of life He wants for them. A Jubilee year is a beautiful thing!

The Church celebrates ordinary Jubilees every 25 years. The last one was the great Jubilee for the new millennium in 2000. In a Jubilee year we have a special invitation to make *pilgrimage* and to receive God's *forgiveness* in extraordinary ways.

People make pilgrimages to Rome in the Jubilee year, but every Diocese also has pilgrimages, and our Diocese has established 5 pilgrimage churches for the Jubilee, including one right here in Council Bluffs! Let's take advantage of this beautiful grace, a year acceptable to the Lord.


