From Father Jacob

Now Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

We sometimes think that the things that Jesus did and the things that happened to Him are unique to Jesus, but *nothing could be further from the truth*. Jesus came to be like us in all things but sin.

Jesus lived in a family so your family could be holy.

Jesus worked so your work could be holy.

Jesus fed the hungry and healed the sick so you could too.

Jesus forgave his enemies so you could too.

Jesus suffered on the cross so your sufferings could be made holy and even life-giving.

Jesus died so even your eventual death could be with Him.

Jesus rose from the dead so that you will rise too.

Of course as God Jesus really is totally unique. But Jesus became man not to be unique, but to make you like Him.

Often we would rather think of Jesus as unique because we don't actually want to be like Him, we just want Him to solve some of our problems and then leave us alone. But:

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all.

We should want to be like Jesus, including in generosity, including in obedience to the Father, including even in sufferings and hardships, so that we can also be like Him in the Father's love and in glorious resurrection! Jesus didn't do any of these things *instead of* you. He did all of them so that, united to Him and filled with His grace, *you could do them too*.

Preparing for Lent

We will begin Lent on Ash Wednesday, which falls on March 5th this year. During the 40 days of Lent, we <u>pray</u>, <u>fast</u>, and <u>give alms</u> in a more intentional way. We do this for several reasons:

- 1. **Sorrow for sin**—when we are sorry for something we naturally want to *do something* as an expression of our sorrow.
- 2. **Union with Christ**—Christians are united to Jesus in every good thing we do. When we voluntarily take on some suffering we are especially united to Him on <u>His cross</u>, which is the source of life and every grace.
- 3. Solidarity with the poor—Jesus chose the cross voluntarily to pay our debts and pour out life and blessings on us. When we choose some cross we can also use it spiritually (offer it up) and practically (a donation, a kindness, money saved) to pay others' debts and give blessings to those in economic, emotional, or spiritual need.
- 4. **To train ourselves**—Athletes train in small, controlled ways so they can do big things on the sports field. We resist some small things that we *could* do to strengthen ourselves to <u>resist sin</u> which we *must not* do.
- 5. **To order the senses**—We give up good things because, even though they are good, <u>they are not the center of our lives</u>. They need to be put in their proper place.
- 6. **To prepare**—We fast now so that we are prepared to <u>feast and celebrate</u> the joys of Easter!


