

Today we celebrate the "octave day" of Easter, the echo feast of the greatest feast of the year! We call today Divine Mercy Sunday. It's true that St John Paul II dedicated the second Sunday of Easter tpo the Divine Mercy in response to St Faustina's petition, but you don't have to love St Faustina to love Divine Mercy Sunday!

This is such an appropriate name for our feast day today, because it is the reason for everything!

Why did God make the universe in the first place? Because He wanted to love it and is so good that He created *you* to be good towards. In other words: Divine Mercy!

Why did God save people over and over again through all of history? Divine Mercy!

Why did God come as Jesus Christ to save us? Divine Mercy!

Why did he go to the cross? Divine Mercy!

Why did he lay in the tomb? Divine Mercy!

Why did he rise again? Why did he appear to the Apostles? Why did he come to Thomas today? Why did he send them out to preach? Why did he ascend into heaven? Why did he send the Holy Spirit? Divine Mercy!


