FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

From Father Jacob

"It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God."

This doesn't seem like good news, does it? But this is part of the Gospel, part of the "good news" that Paul and Barnabas preached.

Sometimes we think that being "blessed" by God means having the maximum of pleasant things and the minimum of unpleasant things happen to us, but Jesus has shown us a very different way. We worship the God who went to the cross, and who was even able to say today just before he died:

"Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him."

Jesus has shown us good news that can include hardships and unpleasantness. Indeed it seems that it even requires it, "it is necessary". Why? Well because his kingdom is a kingdom of love, and in this fallen world and with our fallen hearts, loving on another requires suffering.

Loving one another requires internal suffering because we have to "put to death" that voice in each of us that says we should get what we can, when we can; that other people are an imposition and a burden; or that we should prove how much better we are. Following that voice doesn't actually make anyone happy, but it is a suffering to go against it.

Loving one another requires external suffering because in this fallen world it always comes along with it. The loving thing is usually the thing that requires more work, or getting up, or giving away, or being too hot or too cold, or being bored, etc. Doing the loving thing comes with some suffering in this world.

Jesus's kingdom is a kingdom of love, and to enter it we have to learn to "love one another as I have loved you". In this world that is not easy to do, and so, yes, "it is necessary to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God."


